

Tenendum Clause

In modern Christian marriage vs. Mosaic Christian marriage

Why do modern women find that there are no good men left? It is because modern women demand that both husband and wife be equally bound by the marriage Tenendum clause. Which reduces the number of good men available for marriage.

Modern women don't realize that what they think they want actually hurts them instead of helping them. But instead they are convinced that it helps them. Modern women are raised from infancy to believe this lie. Modern society and modern morality teaches it in every movie, in every nursery rhyme, in grade school, and in social events.

Forcing woman to be bound to the Tenendum clause hurts good woman and makes life easy for a bad man. Bad men get good woman because of this modern lie about what woman should want. 2 Timothy 3:6 For of this sort are they which creep into houses, and lead captive silly women laden with sins, led away with divers lusts,

The truth is instead that Moses binds the man to the Tenendum clause, but does not bind the woman. Exodus 21:10 "If he take him another wife; her food, her raiment, and her duty of marriage, shall he not diminish." This is to love and cherish even at the cost of his life. Genesis 3:16 "Unto the woman he said. . . thy desire shall be to thy husband, and he shall rule over thee." This is to adore and obey.

Moses gave these rules for a very important reason.

What is the Tenendum clause? It is the clause in the traditional marriage vows that says "to have and to hold" These are not romantic words, but legal terminology for the transfer of the responsibility to care for property. In a Mosaic Christian marriage the husband takes possession, to have and to hold, of his wife as his most highly valued property. Property which he loves and cherishes beyond all his money, beyond all his land and tangibles. He cherishes her even to the ultimate cost of even his own life if necessary. 1 Corinthians 7; 1 Corinthians 11:2; Ephesians 5:22

Whereas the wife adores and obeys her husband 1 Corinthians 14:34; 1 Timothy 2:11; Ephesians 5:22; Colossians 3:18; 1 Peter 3:1-6

Modern marriage forces the Tenendum clause on woman, giving both the man and the woman the same vows.

Groom: I, _____, take thee, _____, to be my wedded Wife, to have and to hold from this day forward, for better for worse, for richer for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, till death part us, according to God's holy ordinance; and thereto I plight thee my troth.

Bride: I, _____, take thee, _____, to be my wedded Husband, to have and to hold from this day forward, for better for worse, for richer for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, till death part us, according to God's holy ordinance; and thereto I plight thee my troth.

Under this covenant of marriage each woman gets one man and each man gets one woman, because both possess each other instead of the man possessing something cherished and the woman adoring.

However, only 10% of men keep promises while about 30% of women do. More woman keep their promises than men. And this covenant of marriage does not alter that fact. Instead this modern concept of marriage as one to one partners has an unintended consequence that is hurtful to woman.

When all the good men are paired one to one with good woman that leaves 90% of women which includes 20% of woman that are good women all get the same thing -a bad man. And those bad men have no motivation to improve themselves because there are plenty of woman available for them to find.

What happens when men and women are paired one to one:

This is hurtful to women, though modern woman are taught from early childhood and believe with all their heart that they need to be bound by the same Tenendum clause as their husband.

Mosaic, Christian Marriage binds only the man to the Tenendum clause. This changes everything, it completely reverses the situation. It gives 50% of woman good men. It even gives 20% of bad woman, good men, and the worst men get no wife.

Not binding woman to the Tenendum clause frightens woman who were taught from childhood that they need a man to themselves alone. Whereas, Moses gives different vows to the wife.

Bride: I, _____, take thee, _____, to be my wedded Husband from this day forward, for better for worse, for richer for poorer, in sickness and in health, to adore, and to obey, till death part us, according to God's holy ordinance; and thereto I give thee my troth.

The difference is that the wife does not "have and hold." She is instead the cherished possession. The wife does not "love and cherish," she "adores and obeys." It is in this way that she shows her love; and finally the husband promises his troths even to his "plight" or peril to his life while the wife merely promises her troth. These differences have huge implications. Moses knew best, because God told him how it works.

20% of women who are good end up with the 10% of good, honorable men who keep their promises. The remaining 90% of men can't get two wives and find that there are only 80% of women left and they are looking for good men, which means that the worst 10% of men get no wife . If they don't become good men, they are left out. So the ones that improve get the rest of the good woman and in total 50% of all woman get good men.

This chart shows what happens when the best 10% of men have 2 wives and 80% have 1. and the worst 10% of men find no wife at all.
